



Sovereignty as a western conception originated from European history. When it came to East Asia along with international law, traditional practice of domestic and international affairs, although being here for centuries, faced a

challenge of getting re-legitimated in new legal terms. Tibet issue once arose at the crucial time. The report centers on the evolution of Tibet-China relations before and after international law's dawning in East Asia, and further analyses the polarized arguments on the status of Tibet against the special background of a changing international legal system in late Qing dynasty.
